If you have a foreign academic qualification and want to work in a regulated profession (e.g. as a doctor or lawyer) in Germany, you need to have your foreign academic qualification recognised. In our sections "Who needs recognition" and "Recognition procedure", you will find detailed information on this matter.

You do not need the recognition certificate if you want to work in an academic, non-regulated profession, such as computer scientist, mathematician or economist. If you wish to emigrate from a <u>third country</u> in order to work in Germany, and you require a work <u>visa</u>, such as the <u>EU Blue Card</u>, you must provide proof of your foreign academic qualification being comparable to a German academic qualification. To provide such proof, you can choose one of the following options.

Positive results in the anabin database

The <u>Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB)</u> operates the <u>anabin</u> database, which provides information on the evaluation of foreign educational qualifications and universities. The database is currently available in German.

Statement of Comparability

The <u>Statement of Comparability</u> is an official document which describes your foreign academic qualifications and indicates the level of the German academic qualification to which your foreign qualification is comparable. The individual statement can be requested from the Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB) in Bonn. You must request an individual Statement of Comparability if your university is listed in the anabin database as "H+", but your degree in particular is not listed.

An individual Statement of Comparability can be helpful. It is advantageous when applying for a job, changing jobs, or negotiating salary. With a statement in the German language, employers can better classify the foreign academic qualification. The Statement of Comparability can also be used when applying for a visa.

Info box

Please note that the processing time can be up to three months, if you have provided all the necessary documents. If you apply for an evaluation in order to receive an <u>EU</u> <u>Blue Card</u>, the processing time will take two weeks. Please attach a copy of your work contract in this case.
